Infusing her passion for journalism and social justice, Selena created "[Let Your Voice Be Heard!](#)" a live radio show and podcast that is released on Spotify, iTunes, iHeart Radio, and Stitcher. The award-winning talk show focuses on politics, social issues, and pop culture from a diverse millennial perspective. It broadcasts on [WHCR 90.3 FM](#) "The Voice of Harlem" and is streamed on Facebook Live every Sunday at 11 am ET. A number of high-profile speakers have appeared on the show, including Sen. Cory Booker, NYC Mayor Bill de Blasio, and Russell Simmons.

Selena is also the host of season 7 of "[What's Eating Harlem](#)," where she interviews and shares stories about Harlem-based entrepreneurs, tastemakers, and movers-and-shakers. The show airs on PBS local affiliate station NYC Life.

In the past, Selena has worked as the Special Election Coverage Reporter covering the 2012 presidential election at [GlobalGrind.com](#). In addition, she freelanced for the [New York Amsterdam News](#), one of the nation's longest running historically Black newspapers.
